

Presentation marking scheme (these sections should be clearly indicated in your presentation):

- Introduction to the problem (3 points)
- What's the research question? (2 points)
- How does your model provide a framework for your research question? (3 points)
- How was your data collected and how did you deal with missing data? (3 points)
- What are your results? (3 points)
- How did you validate your results? (2 points)
- What are the implications of your study? (3 points)
- References (1 point)

There are also 5 points for the oral presentation, for a total of 25 points.

Here are some guidelines for a good presentation:

- Don't read out your slides
- Don't put too much text on each slide.
- Don't put your entire presentation on the slide.
- Choose a clear font (simple and professional).
- Don't make your font too small.
- Make your slides visually appealing
- Use colours that can be easily seen.
- Ensure you cover both the biology and the math.
- Practice at least three practice times beforehand, preferably with an audience (friends, family etc).
